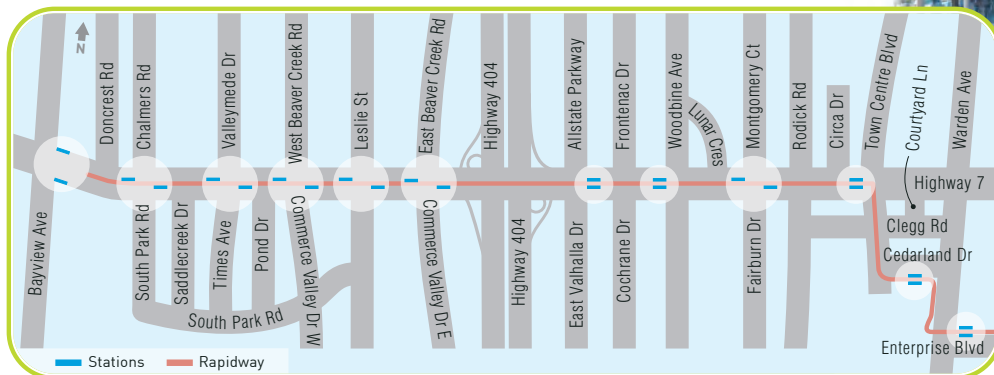




vivanext

rapidway on highway 7 east



location

- City of Markham and Town of Richmond Hill.
- Highway 7 from Bayview Avenue to Warden Avenue at Enterprise Boulevard, via South Town Centre Boulevard and Cedarland Drive.

funding

- funded by Metrolinx, an agency of the Province of Ontario, as part of their \$1.4 billion commitment to improving transit in York Region.

length and station information

- 6 kilometres.
- one curb-side station at Bayview Avenue, and 10 centre-lane vivastations at Chalmers, Valleymede, West Beaver Creek, Leslie, East Beaver Creek, Allstate, Woodbine, Montgomery, South Town Centre and Cedarland.

connections

- viva vehicles travelling the Highway 7 East rapidway will connect with YRT, viva and GO buses and GO trains at Richmond Hill Centre and Unionville GO Station, and TTC subway and buses at Finch Subway Station.

timelines

- construction began in 2010 and the last segment opened in January 2015.

unique attributes

- the vivastation at Bayview Avenue is curb-side with two levels, to allow customers to transfer between east-west transit service on Highway 7 and north-south service above on Bayview Avenue.
- the Highway 7 East rapidway connects to Warden Station on Enterprise Boulevard in Markham – York Region's first built example of a vivastation.
